Our Mission: Men giving real time to positively impact the development and outcomes of youth in our communities” The concept of 100 Black Men grew from the turbulent conditions of the 1960s when a group of concerned African American men began to explore ways to improve their community. In 1963, one hundred black men representing a cross section of New York City forged a leadership alliance to help direct their community through troubled times. To ensure the quality of life in their communities the group focused their resources on youth development and adopted the name, 100 Black Men Inc., as a sign of solidarity. Today, 100 Black Men of America is based in Atlanta, Georgia and has more than 100 chapters worldwide.

The Beautillion Militaire Scholarship Program is a leadership development initiative designed to prepare young men for post-secondary success and community involvement. This 26-session program, targeted at high school seniors, fosters critical thinking, cultural awareness, and purposeful living. Participants engage in self-improvement topics such as financial management, college preparation, and career development, under the guidance of mentors from 100 Black Men. Additionally, they take part in cultural activities, receive education on health and relationships, and build teamwork and discipline through precision military drills. The program concludes with the creation of a personalized 'Man Plan,' which outlines their future goals and the steps necessary to achieve them. On average, the program enrolls 40 participants annually.

DOLLARS AND SENSE FINANCIAL LITERACY

DOLLARS AND SENSE FINANCIAL LITERACY is a 16-week Saturday program at the University of Indianapolis for high school students. It covers financial management and investments through lectures and activities. Students create and present investment portfolios, earning scholarship funds upon completion. Since 2022, parallel parents-only sessions promote family financial literacy. The program averages 15-20 participants annually. **Program Partnerships: University of Indianapolis and State Farm**





SUMMER ACADEMY

"Summer Academy has really boosted my child's confidence in ways that I don't think would have happened if they'd done something else this summer. Summer Academy is a six-week program for Pre-K to 8th-gradestudents aimed at preventing summer learning loss. Running Monday to Friday, 8:00 am to 3:00 pm, it combines academics with cultural and recreational activities. Mornings include breakfast, group exercises, recitation of positive affirmations, and classes led by licensed educators in subjects like math, reading, and African American history. After lunch, the afternoons feature unique community and enrichment activities such as field trips and music technology. These enriching opportunities provide students with exposure to valuable, often inaccessible experiences. Over 200 students participate in the program annually.

TEAM MENTORING

TEAM MENTORING is a multi-week initiative aimed at mentoring young men in grades 5-9. The program covers topics such as conflict resolution, leadership skills, mentoring, health and wellness, education, and economic empowerment. The primary objectives of the program are to improve school grades, develop leadership skills, and encourage teamwork among participants. This is facilitated through various activities, including teamwork exercises, communication activities, music-related activities, and STEM-related activities focused on coding. The program typically involves around 30 students each year. **Program Partnerships: Big Brothers Big Sisters of Central Indiana, Joyful Noyze, and Universe Conspired**
